## **Article Specifics**

Each article should:

- 1. Have a informative, entertaining and accessible tone.
- 2. Focus on information that the average horse owner or enthusiast can understand.
- 3. Include direct quotes from experts on the topic, if a health or training article.
- 4. Avoid boring summaries of the topic.
- 5. Create entertaining and intriguing headlines and decks, including key words to the topic.
- 6. You are writing for an online audience. Remember to be relevant, intriguing and use action words. Lists are good things to include.
- 7. Feel free to include your own experiences or anecdotes of people you know.
- 8. Article should be between 500 and 1,200 words.

# **Art/Photos/Videos**

We also ask you to supply high-quality photos or art (or videos if assigned) with full copyright permissions and credits. If you have any photo/art concerns, please let us know.

### What We Don't Want

We don't want writers that need a lot of editing, don't follow the assignment, miss their deadlines and aren't web-savvy writers.

# What We Pay

\$25 for news item \$50 for 500 to 1,000 words (tips, listicles, personal columns) \$75 for 750 to 1,200 words that includes quotes and photos/videos. \$100 to \$150 for an article written by an expert (veterinarian or other professional) that includes photos/videos

### **How to Submit**

Please take a look at current content on HorseChannel.com to ensure that your article ideas fit with our voice. Most of the longer, more in-depth health and training articles are assigned to established contributors. We recommend starting with a listicle or first-person column (note: we do not publish fiction.)
