EQUINE INFLUENZA: What horse owners need to know.

SYMPTOMS	 Fever as high as 105 degrees Fahrenheit Nasal discharge Depression Loss of appetite Dry cough Enlarged lymph nodes around the throat Muscle soreness and reluctance to move
TREATMENT	 Pain medication, typically flunixin meglumine (Banamine) Ensure adequate hydration Keep horse in a quiet, stress-free environment Antibiotics, if recommended by veterinarian
PREVENTION	 Vaccination is recommended for most horses. Frequency of vaccination will depend on the horse's living arrangements and lifestyle. Quarantine new horses entering a stable for 14 days. Ensure good air circulation in the stable and minimize dust from hay and straw. Keep stalls properly clean to ensure respiratory health
