| Sticky traps | All flies | During fly season | Use in conjunction with other fly-control methods; these traps are just to catch the ones that make it into the barn. |
| Fly sheets, masks and mesh leg wraps | All flies | During fly season | These fly barriers are the final line of protection for your horse and should be used in addition to other fly control management techniques. |
| Fly spray | Stable flies, house flies and mosquitoes | During fly season | Use enough spray to make your horse's entire coat damp. |
| Feed-through fly control | Stable flies and house flies | Before fly season | All horses on the property must be on this program for it to work. |
| Parasitic Wasps | Stable flies and house flies | When the temperature rises above 45 degrees | The wasps are not immune to fly repellant; use fly sprays with caution when you are using parasitic wasps. |
| Composting manure | Stable flies and house flies | Year round | Follow correct composting protocol and keep the compost pile away from the pasture. |
| Spreading manure | Stable flies and house flies | Summer | Spreading manure only works during sustained hot, dry weather and should only be done if horses are kept off the area for the following 2-3 weeks. |
